- Recorders will also be asked to take notes for the presenters on matters that she may want to follow-up on with an attendee after the conference





FINANCIAL OFFICERS' CERTIFICATION TRAINING

This training is offered to current and aspiring Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority chapter financial officers and members. This one-day, interactive, hands-on certification is designed to assist the graduate chapter Tamiouchos and Pecunious Grammateus in executing their operational responsibilities. Sorors will be trained in the proper implementation of financial procedures as outlined in the Fiscal Fitness Guide For Chapter Financial Operations and referenced in several other sorority documents. A creative, learning approach will be used to enhance the core competencies of certification participants. Sorors who successfully complete this training will earn the designation of Certified Financial Officer.

Registration will be limited to 75 sorors and priority will be given to current chapter financial officers. Sorors are responsible for downloading all class materials prior to coming to certification training.

FOC training fee: \$85.00 (Lunch included)

The FOC training fee must be received with the conference registration fee in order to be registered to attend this one day training.

GRADUATE ADVISORS' CERTIFICATION TRAINING PROGRAM GENERAL INFORMATION 2019 REGIONAL CONFERENCES AND 2019 LEADERSHIP SEMINAR

Authority: Article III, Section 22, Constitution and Bylaws and the results of sorority litigation.

Who must receive Graduate Advisors' Certification?

- Candidates for advisor to an undergraduate chapter
- Members of the chapter's Graduate Advisory Committee
- Sorors in chapter leadership positions (Optional)
- Sorors planning to pursue international offices

What is the Graduate Advisors' Certification?

- **LEVEL I** an introductory training for candidates for Graduate Advisor, Graduate Advisory Committee Members, sorors in chapter leadership positions who have never been certified and sorors who have allowed their certification to expire (certifications expire after three years on December 31).
- **LEVEL II** an intermediate training for candidates for Graduate Advisor, Graduate Advisory Committee Members and sorors in chapter leadership positions who are seeking to recertify within the effective period of their certification.

What forms and documents are required for Graduate Advisors' Certification?

- From Applying Soror to Basileus or Grammateus of chapter:
 - Review application and sign verification statement (Sorors who are serving as Basileus or Grammateus who seek to participate in the training cannot provide the verification signature for her own application. The Basileus must obtain the verification signature of the Grammateus and vice versa.)
- From Applying Soror to International Graduate Advisors' Certification Training Committee: (PLEASE NOTE THE REGION YOU ARE REQUESTING TO TAKE THE TRAINING ON THE ENVELOPE)

Do not require a signature for delivery tracking as your package may be rejected; rather use delivery confirmation.

- o ORIGINAL Application signed/dated in the presence of a notary.
- SEALED Official Transcript or Letter (with raised seal) from college/university as proof
 that soror is at least a five-year, post-baccalaureate graduate; transcripts will not be returned
 after evaluation.
- o COPY of payment \$40.00 Regional Conference or \$85.00 Leadership Seminar payment.
- Send application, transcript and copy of payment to: International Graduate Advisors'

 - (PLEASE NOTE THE REGION YOU ARE REQUESTING TO TAKE THE TRAINING ON THE ENVELOPE)

Which sorors DO NOT need to submit an official transcript or official letter proving she is at least a five-year, post-baccalaureate graduate?

- Sorors applying for Level II recertification
- Sorors who have previously received Level I certification (since July 2003)

How will the soror know that she has been approved or denied for the certification training?

 Sorors will receive approval confirmation by email from the International Graduate Advisors' Certification Training Committee. Sorors will received notification of approval 10 days before the certification training.

OR

Sorors will receive denial confirmation by email from the International Graduate Advisors'
Certification Training Committee if documents are received after the postmark deadline; or are
incomplete; or cannot be verified. <u>NOTICE OF YOUR APPROVAL OR DENIAL WILL NOT
COME FROM CORPORATE OFFICE.</u>

What does the fee include?

- The \$40.00 Regional Conference training fee will include a training package containing the following:
 - o Graduate Advisors' Certification Training Manual
 - o Undergraduate Membership Intake Manual
 - o General Information for the Collegian
 - Fiscal Fitness
 - o Anti-Hazing Handbook
- The \$85.00 Leadership fee will include the same course materials along with a lunch.

What is the deadline for submitting documents to the International Graduate Advisors' Certification Training Committee and Corporate Office?

- The postmark deadline for submitting documentation and fees for any 2019 Regional Conference is **February 1, 2019**.
- The postmark deadline for submitting documentation and fees for the 2019 Leadership Seminar is **April 15, 2019.**

Additional Information

- Sorors must be registered for the conference at which the Graduate Advisors' Certification Training is to be received.
- Certification and recertification expire after three years on December 31; you must be recertified
 prior to your expiration. Sorors who fail to recertify prior to her expiration will have to complete
 Level I training.
- If a soror cannot attend the certification training on the dates/location originally indicated on her application, she may request to transfer her registration to a subsequent Regional Conference (at the discretion of the Regional Directors) or the Leadership Seminar provided it is for 2019. A soror must submit a request for transfer in writing or by email within six weeks prior to the original conference date. Requests should be submitted to International Graduate Advisors' Certification Training Committee, c/o Soror Joanna Langston, PO Box 7595, Gwynn Oak, Maryland 21207. Refunds are issued when member is deemed ineligible, withdraws her application or cancels conference registration and does not transfer to another conference. Refunds are scheduled to be issued after Leadership Seminar.
